### In Her Dream It Was a Boy

Masha came for a pregnancy test. When she saw that it was positive, she burst out sobbing. She and her husband couldn't go through that pain again.

Their first girl was born with cerebral palsy. Then they had a healthy girl and also welcomed the third pregnancy with all their hearts knowing it was going to be a boy. The greetings from friends, family, and co-workers were still coming, when on the third day after the delivery the little boy passed away. The tragedy wounded both hearts deeply. Moreover, the doctors diagnosed their incompatibility and predicted that future pregnancies would result in either child's disability or death. Grieving the lost child and trying to reconcile with the doctors' news, they were not ready for another pregnancy. It seemed easier to relieve their pain with an abortion, but the night before the pregnancy test Masha dreamed that the baby was going to be a boy.

During counseling Masha wouldn't stop sobbing. Tears streamed down her face. It seemed her mind was blocked to all facts and reasoning. Masha still does not know what choice she will make. Please pray for her to choose life.
