I don't want to go home

'I don't want to go home. It feels like heaven here' shared the parents of both children with disabilities and Lifesavers children on the last day of camp. For little over a week (June 28 – July 6) children and parents had a chance to experience God's presence and get a glimpse of Who He really is at MTU overnight 'Good Mansion' camp. Four mothers accepted Jesus into their hearts. Hallelujah!

To unveil more of the spiritual power of camps we would like to share with you a taste of their experiences.

The pain of hearing that God is punishing me because of my sin is nearly unbearable. I wanted to think that it was untrue, but as more and more people tell me that my child is disabled because of my sin I begin to believe this.

Ashamed of having a child with disabilities, my neighbors have been keeping their boy at home for six years now... since his birth. Six years he has seen nothing, but his room and some nature revealed by the window.

"Your crippled children are not humans; they are plants" that's what people say.

One lifesavers mom shared: 'When I was pregnant with my second youngest child my mother told me that if I gave birth to this child there would be something wrong with it. If an abortion was not done, my mother threatened to take it by its leg and throw against the wall. My mother works me like a slave and I work so hard taking care of all the animals, all my children and my parents, and yet at 40 years old, I feel like a child stuck in this home. Then I come to camp and see how happy people live and I am stuck in such a home with no love but only threats...How can I go home?
